**Tabaimo:** *flow-wer arrangement* February 10 – March 15, 2018

Gallery Koyanagi is proud to present a solo exhibition by Tabaimo, titled "*flow-wer arrangement*" from Saturday, February 10 to Thursday, March 15. The exhibition will feature her recent works from the *flow-wer* series Tabaimo has been working on since 2013. A group of the drawings that depict flowers sprung from the inner parts of human body will be juxtaposed with a new installation "flow-wer arrangement" which consists of a large wall drawing and video projection over it. The "flow-wer arrangement" was first presented at Hammer Museum, Los Angels in 2017 and its large-scale installation drew wide attention internationally. The work will be reproduced in the gallery for the first time after the premier at the Hammer Museum.

In the last few years, she has been energetically engaged in a variety of stage collaborations such as Pascal Rogé's concert for Hamarikyu Asahi Hall 20th anniversary in 2012, and the Ningyo Joruri (traditional Japanese puppet theater) "Sonezaki Shinju" produced and the script written by Hiroshi Sugimoto in 2014. Also, she directed the performance "Fruits borne out of rust" in 2016.

#### **Biography**

Tabaimo was born in 1975, currently lives and works in Nagano, Japan.

Received the Kirin Contemporary Awards' grand prize 1999 for her installation "Japanese Kitchen" using animation through video.

Starting from the 1st Yokohama Triennale in 2001, she has exhibited her works in various international exhibitions, including the 54th Venice Biennale in 2011 when she represented Japan with her solo exhibition "teleco-soup" in the Japan Pavilion.

She has presented her solo shows at major museums over the world such as Hammer Museum, Los Angels, CA (2017); the San Jose Museum of Art, San Jose, CA (2016); the Museum of Contemporary Art, Australia, Sydney (2014); Parasol unit foundation for contemporary art, London (2010); Moderna Museet, Stockholm (2009); Fondation Cartier pour l'art contemporain, Paris (2006); Hara Museum of Contemporary Art, Tokyo (2006).

In the last few years, she has been actively involved in a variety of stage collaborations including Pascal Rogé's concert for Hamarikyu Asahi Hall 20th anniversary in 2012, and the Ningyo Joruri (traditional Japanese puppet theater) "Sonezaki Shinju" produced and the script written by Hiroshi Sugimoto in 2014.
